- **Concept 2 Workshop Recap: Chris L.**
 - Concept 2: “When, in 1955, the A.A. groups confirmed the permanent charter for their General Service Conference, they thereby delegated to the Conference complete authority for the active maintenance of our world services and thereby made the Conference — excepting for any change in the Twelve Traditions or in Article 12 of the Conference Charter — the actual voice and the effective conscience for our whole Society.”
 - Synopsis: “Concept I establishes the “final responsibility and ultimate authority” of the A.A. groups; but, in actual practice, how are they to manage A.A.’s service affairs? By delegation, Concept II declares. Bill and Dr. Bob, entrusted by the early groups to get the program going and to spread the message, found nonalcoholic friends to help them. They formed a trusteeship and delegated to it the responsibility for finances, the Big Book and other literature, public information, the service office and the AA Grapevine. However, as the trustees constantly looked to the co-founders for advice and guidance and the groups also continued to hold them accountable, it was evident that the leadership should be transferred to the A.A. groups as a whole. But if the groups were to carry on their primary purpose, they would have to delegate their leadership role to a General Service Conference. They do this by electing a General Service Representative for each group.”

- **Special Presentation**
 - Guest speaker, Bob M., D12 Treasurer: “Demystifying the Area and its Meetings”
 - There are several different types of Area 9 meetings.
 1. Area Service Committee meetings (ASC)
 - a. Issues, policy decisions, recommendations, and other actions of the area are introduced at the ASC meetings and voted on at the three annual Assembly meetings.

- b. All GSRs, DCMs, district officers, area officers, and committee chairs are voting members of the assembly.
 - c. Meetings begin with a briefing by the Delegate followed by the committee breakouts. GSRs can choose to participate in any of the committee breakouts.
 - d. After lunch, the business meeting begins where any official actions are taken and presentations by the Districts and Area committee chairs are heard.
 - e. ASC meetings precede assembly meetings.
 - 2. Assembly meetings
 - a. Preceded by ASC meetings.
 - b. The business of the area is conducted in the assembly.
 - c. There are three assemblies per year.
 - d. The 2021 assemblies will be in May, September, and December.
 - 3. Pre-Conference Workshop
 - a. Held in April each year to discuss and form a group conscience on agenda items to be considered at the annual General Service Conference.
 - b. At this meeting we let our Delegate know our opinions on the work of the Conference.
 - c. This is one of the most important meetings for GSRs and other interested members.
 - 4. Foro meeting
 - a. Held in July each year.
 - b. Sponsored by the Spanish-speaking districts, this is a service conference that is conducted in Spanish with English translation.
 - 5. Area Elections
 - a. Held in October of odd-numbered years.
 - b. Election to select Area officers and our Delegate to the General Service Conference.
 - c. GSRs are required to attend at least one Area 09 meeting in order to vote in the annual elections.
